### **European Union Restriction of Hazardous Substances (RoHS) 2002/95/EC**

Motorola's commitment to Corporate Citizenship Business Principles and its Code of Business Conduct is unwavering. Our policy is to meet or exceed all applicable environmental, health, safety, legal and other requirements in the countries where we do business.

The RoHS Directive 2002/95/EC requires producers to ensure that as of July 1, 2006, any new electrical and electronic equipment placed on the European Union (EU) market does not contain more than 0.1 percent by weight of lead, mercury, hexavalent chromium, polybrominated biphenyls (PBB) or polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE) and 0.01 percent by weight of cadmium per homogeneous material. Many Motorola products placed on the EU market after June 30, 2006 are subject to the EU RoHS Directive, including its hazardous substance restrictions and associated exemptions. All affected Motorola products shipped to the EU after June 30, 2006 comply with the RoHS Directives requirements.

Since the Directive's adoption in 2002, Motorola has been developing and continues to refine its Company-wide programs for working with its suppliers, laboratories, design, engineering and manufacturing teams, and other stakeholders to ensure that our products meet the Directive's requirements. Motorola has implemented a comprehensive system for obtaining supplier declarations and material disclosures concerning the chemical composition of all components and products designed, manufactured or utilized by Motorola without regard to where products are ultimately going to be sold or deployed. Motorola also utilizes random testing as another means of verifying and assuring ongoing compliance with the Directive. Our systems leverage Motorola's high standards for quality and ethics to assure that our products meet or exceed regulatory obligations and customer requirements.
