Safe Driving Tips

If you consider a call necessary and appropriate, practice good driving judgment by following these tips:

- **Use** a hands-free device, when available.
- **Secure** your phone within easy reach.
- Let your **voice mail** answer your phone if you can.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving and that you will **suspend the call** if a problem driving situation arises.
- Don't place or answer a call during **hazardous driving** conditions or situations.
- Don't take **notes or look up** phone numbers while driving.
- Do **assess traffic** before placing a call. Place calls when you are not moving or before pulling into traffic.
- Don't engage in **emotional conversations**. They are distracting and even dangerous when you are behind the wheel.
- Do use your phone to **call for help** in an emergency. In the United States, dial 9-1-1 in the case of fire, traffic accident, road hazard or medical emergencies. Remember, **it is a free call** on your wireless phone!
