

Independent Greenhouse Gas Verification Statement for Motorola Inc.

As a member of the Chicago Climate Exchange (CCX), Motorola Inc. has committed to a voluntary yet legally binding agreement to reduce its greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 6% below year 2000 levels by 2010. To ensure compliance with the CCX program, Motorola must report its baseline and annual GHG emission levels, which are reviewed for accuracy and completeness by FINRA (Financial Industry Regulatory Authority), CCX's independent, 3rd party provider of verification services. As part of the CCX program, FINRA has carried out a verification of Motorola's reported global 2007 emissions to ensure that the company's reported GHG levels conform with the CCX Rulebook and WBCSD/WRI GHG Accounting Protocol for direct and indirect emission sources.

Conclusions

To conduct its analysis, FINRA reviewed a sample of sufficient size and distribution necessary to generate projections about the accuracy of Motorola's data at a 95% statistical confidence level. Based on the number of discrepancies noted in the sampled data, a sampling tool created a probability-based projection range of the likely occurrence of discrepancies in the overall detection population. These projections and staff's ability to identify and isolate the root causes of the noted discrepancies provides the basis for generalizations about the accuracy of the Motorola's reported emission levels. Based on FINRA's review, CCX concludes:

- Motorola's GHG data reporting and accounting for 2007 are carried out according to the CCX Rulebook and WBCSD/WRI Protocol.
- Motorola's 2007 GHG emission reporting is free of any significant errors and data gaps.
